The key areas covered this term:

For our non-narrative unit, we will explore the range of linguistic and presentational features used in information texts with a view to producing our own information leaflets all about the varied geographical features of Russia.

Our spelling work will focus on a range of prefixes, suffixes and apostrophes used in contractions. We will also learn a selection of statutory words from the Year 3 and 4 spelling lists.
