English

<u>Composition</u> This halt term we will be writing narratives, writing setting descriptions and writing recounts of our trip.

<u>Vocabulary, Punctuation and Grammar - We will</u> learn: to spell more words with contracted forms

learn the possessive apostrophe (singular) [for example, the girl's book]

distinguish between homophones and nearhomophones

add suffixes to spell longer words, including -ment, -ness, -ful, -less, -ly

<u>Spelling -</u> We will continue to practise our high frequency words, learn spelling rules and also common exception words.

Maths

This half term we will learn about fractions and measure.

We will recognise, find, name and write fractions I/3, $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{2}{4}$ and $\frac{3}{4}$ and of a length, shape, set of objects or quantity

write simple fractions for example, $\frac{1}{2}$ of 6 = 3 and recognise the equivalence of $\frac{2}{4}$ and $\frac{1}{2}$.

We will also look at measure choose and use appropriate standard units to estimate and measure length/height in any direction (m/cm); mass (kg/g); temperature (°C); capacity (litres/ml) to the nearest appropriate unit, using rulers, scales, thermometers and measuring vessels

compare and order lengths, mass, volume/capacity and record the results using >,

Geography

In Geography we will look at the human and features of Portsmouth and the capital city of Bangladesh, Dhaka.

We will visit the seafront to identify the features as well as go on a local walk. We will use maps and atlases to identify different areas of the world.

This half term we will be looking at the Christian Festival of Easter and linking this to happy and sad celebrations.

PSHE

In PSHE we are looking at the topic of Healthy Me. We will learn how to keep ourselves safe and healthy and different relaxation techniques.

Science

We are looking continuing to look at materials. We will be looking at the features of materials and their suitability for certain jobs. The children will be making their own 'little pigs' house and evaluating the effectiveness of the materials.

Computing

This unit introduces the learners to the term 'data'. Learners will begin to understand what data means and how this can be collected in the form of a tally chart. They will learn the term 'attribute' and use this to help them organise data. They will then progress onto presenting data in the form of pictograms and finally block diagrams. Learners will use the data presented to answer questions.
