What do we mean by ‘Safeguarding’?

Safeguarding and promoting the welfare includes:

- Protecting children from maltreatment
- Preventing impairment of children’s health and development
- Ensuring that children are growing up in circumstances consistent with the provision of safe and effective care



What is the difference between Child Protection and Safeguarding?

‘Child protection’ signifies the action that is put in place to protect specific children who are suffering from, or at risk of suffering from significant harm.

‘Safeguarding’ signifies the wider network involved in protecting children. This can include areas such as: health and safety, bullying, medical needs, first aid, security, drug and substance misuse.



What role does Arundel Court play in Safeguarding and promoting the welfare of our children?

School will take all appropriate actions to address any concerns about the welfare of a child, or children (anyone under the age of 18yrs). We work in accordance to the local agreed policies and procedures and in full partnership with other local agencies.
